#### Stay Awake - Prepared for Christ's Coming

The word 'advent' means 'coming' or 'arrival'. It is about keeping watch, and staying vigilant, because we do not know the day or the hour when Christ will come again. It will come upon us with the suddenness of a rainstorm out of a blue sky.

Noah prepared himself in the calm weather before the flood, so that when it did come he was ready, while the rest of humanity was lost in 'eating and drinking and merrymaking' and were swept away, completely unaware.

These verses are a warning to us not to become so absorbed in time that we forget all about eternity, which is our final destiny.

However, we must remember that our watching for Christ's coming should not be in fear or apprehension, rather, eager expectation for the coming of glory and joy.

#### **Feasts & Solemnities**

Monday 1<sup>st</sup> **St Andrew** Apostle *red* Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> **Saint Nicholas** Bishop *white* 

St Andrew the Apostle was one of the 12 chosen by Jesus. He was a fisherman who was a disciple of John the Baptist, the Voice crying in the wilderness to prepare a way for the Lord. It was he who introduced his brother Simon Peter to Jesus. When the place where his bones were kept was invaded, it is said that St Regulus, (known as St Rule - his name may be familiar from the tall tower in St Andrews) was guided (in a dream) to take them on board a ship and found a church to house them wherever he landed. The ship was caught in a storm, which cast St Rule and the holy relics on a Fife shore. The town surrounding the chapel he built for the saint, became an important pilgrimage centre. St Andrew's special connection with Scotland led to him becoming the nation's patron.

When Christ our Lord to Andrew cried,

'Come thou and follow me,'
The fisher left his net beside the Sea of Galilee.

To teach the truth his Master taught,

To tread the path he trod

Was all his will, and thus he brought

Unnumbered souls to God.

St Nicholas was Bishop in what is now a region in Turkey. He died in the 4<sup>th</sup> century but is remembered for his generous good works. It is said that he dropped purses of gold down a chimney to give the three daughters of a poor man dowries that allowed them to marry, rather than be put to work disreputably. Though the Bishop made his gifts secretly with no strings attached, the three purses of gold are recalled in the three golden balls that appear outside pawnbrokers' shops.

The Bishop is patron of sailors (recalling how prayers rescued mariners), merchants, archers, children, brewers and toymakers as well as pawnbrokers and unmarried people. Saint Nick's secret gifts gained him an image that led to stories of Santa Claus. In Holland clogs were left next to the fireplace, filled with hay and food for the donkey that helped St Nick deliver gifts. In return the saint, or his helpers, left fruit or cake. From this tradition comes the leaving of a mince pie for Santa and a carrot for his reindeer present bearers.

False! It was actually Martin Luther who encouraged followers to light a *tree* in their homes to bring in the 'night sky' as the starry candles would remind of Christ's heavenly home and help them contemplate and draw nearer. This year the Vatican tree in St Peter's Square, lit on the 27<sup>th</sup> November, is an 88 foot tall spruce tree sent as a gift from the Italian Alps.

True! St Francis advocated singing *Christmas songs* and, back in 1223, it was he who first made a *crib* scene to bring alive the good news story of the nativity. He asked his farmer friend to set up a real manger with a real ox and donkey on an Italian hillside. Why? So his fellow brothers and townsfolk could share the experience by torchlight before sharing communion. He wanted people to feel the poverty and hardship suffered by Mary and Joseph and to sense the holiness of the birth. As Pope Francis put it, 'With Christ, joy is constantly born anew.'

The first candle of Advent represents *Hope*, anticipating the arrival of the Messiah.

The Pope's December Prayer Intention is 'that Christians living in the midst of war may be seeds of peace.'
